

We are devastated by the horrific tragedy at the Lapu-Lapu Festival and want to express our deep solidarity with the Filipino community and all those who have been impacted. Virtual debrief and processing space

Well, we are a little over a week after the Federal Election on April 28th and the surprises contained in that. Canada did speak clearly in that outcome. Participation in the election by our members was high, as it always is. Teachers are always a reliable voting bloc in any election, along with retirees. It was also uplifting to see our folks participating in campaigns, helping out on election day and similar. We fundamentally get the electoral process we actively support politically. I do understand there is happiness and disappointment, often in equal measure, with any election. The Federal election can be something of a distant thing to us, as provincial elections and school board elections have a more obvious and direct impact on our working lives. However, it did really appear existential to a lot of folks this time around. Lastly, it does appear we will need a second by-election for school trustee at some point shortly, as another trustee, Zoe Royer, has been successful in this election. That is two this year, as Jennifer Blatherwick was previously successful provincially. Stay tuned for updates as soon as we get them from the School Board.




